1	The OIG transmitted its first monthly report to Recovery.gov. Inspectors General are required to independently report monthly on all obligations for Recovery oversight activities at their respective agencies for both Recovery Act funds and non-Recovery Act funds. The OIG also posted this information on its ARRA website.	The OIG will start work on an audit of Outreach on COBRA Provisions in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. The audit objective is to determine whether EBSA has adequately planned and implemented COBRA provisions under ARRA.
2	The OIG participated in the first meeting of the Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board Working Group. The Working Group includes high-level officials from the 28 Federal agencies which received funds under the ARRA. The Group will assist the Board in coordinating the oversight activities of the various OIGs, share information, and communicate with the public. The Group will initially meet monthly. Working Group teams will focus on specific issues of common interest to the OIGs.	On May 14th the OIG will be briefing the National Association of State Workforce Agencies on OIG's plans for Recovery Act oversight.
3		The contract for the audit of states' use of the extra \$25 weekly benefit allowance under ARRA's unemployment insurance provisions will be awarded.
4		The OIG will Issue a RFQ for contractor to audit how the Department of Labor awards its competitive discretionary grants for training for jobs in high growth and emerging sectors.
5		The OIG will issue discussion draft report on DOL's plans for accounting for and reporting obligations and expenditures under ARRA.
6		The OIG will be providing a mechanism on its web page to report whistleblower complaints under ARRA.
7		The OIG will be submitting its draft work plan to OMB on May 15, 2009.
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
